

### What are Ordinal Numbers?

Ordinal numbers show position or order (not quantity).

1st = first

2nd = second

3rd = third

4th = fourth

### Why Do We Use Them?

We use ordinal numbers to talk about:

Dates → "My birthday is on the 21st of June."

Order  $\rightarrow$  "She came 2nd in the race."

Floors  $\rightarrow$  "He lives on the 5th floor."

The "th" sounds like a"F"

### Taxi driver

☑ English sentence: A taxi driver drives a car. He or she takes people to places.

### **Police officer**

English sentence: A police officer helps people and keeps the city safe.

### **Construction worker**

English sentence: A construction worker builds houses and buildings.

## **Hairdresser / Stylist**

☑ English sentence: A hairdresser cuts and styles people's hair.

### **Waitress**

✓ English sentence: A waitress works in a restaurant. She brings food and drinks to people.

✓ Turkish job title: Bayan garson (but often just Garson is used for both)

✓ Pronunciation: /WEY-tris/ (Veytris)



### Librarian

English sentence: A librarian works in a library. He or she helps people find books.

✓ Pronunciation: /lay-BRER-i-ən/ (Laybreriin)



### **Firefighter**

☑ English sentence: A firefighter stops fires and saves people.

✓ Turkish job title: İtfaiyeci

✓ Pronunciation: /FAYır-fay-tır/ (Fayır faytır)



### **Plumber**

English sentence: A plumber fixes water pipes and bathrooms.

✓ Turkish job title: Tesisatçı

✓ Pronunciation: /PLAM-ır/ (Plamır)











### Chef

✓ English sentence: A chef cooks food in a restaurant or hotel.

✓ Turkish job title: Şef / Aşçı
✓ Pronunciation: /ŞEF/ (Şef)

### Gardener

✓ English sentence: A gardener takes care of plants and flowers.

✓ Turkish job title: Bahçıvan

✓ Pronunciation: /GAR-dın-ır/ (Gardınır)

### Lawyer

✓ English sentence: A lawyer helps people with the law and in court.

✓ Turkish job title: Avukat

✓ Pronunciation: /LOY-ır/ (Loyır)

### **Security guard**

✓ English sentence: A security guard protects people and buildings.

✓ Turkish job title: Güvenlik görevlisi

✓ Pronunciation: /sı-KYU-ri-ti gard/ (Sikyuriti gard)

### Engineer

✓ English sentence: An engineer designs and builds machines, roads, or buildings.

✓ Turkish job title: Mühendis

Pronunciation: /en-ci-NİR/ (Encinir)











### **Butcher**

English sentence: A butcher cuts and sells meat.

✓ Turkish job title: Kasap

✓ Pronunciation: /BU-chir/ (Buçir)

### **Cleaner / Janitor**

English sentence: A cleaner or janitor cleans buildings, offices, or schools.

✓ Turkish job title: Temizlikçi / Hizmetli

✓ Pronunciation: /KLİ-nır/ or /CE-nı-tır/ (Klinır / Cenıtır)

### **Teacher**

English sentence: A teacher helps students learn at school.

✓ Turkish job title: Öğretmen ✓ Pronunciation: /Tİ-çır/ (Tiçır)

### **Driver**

English sentence: A driver drives a car, bus, or truck.

✓ Turkish job title: Şoför

✓ Pronunciation: /DRAY-vir/ (Drayvir)

### **Architect**

✓ English sentence: An architect designs buildings and houses.

✓ Turkish job title: Mimar

Pronunciation: /AR-ki-tekt/ (Arkitekt)



### **Farmer**

✓ English sentence: A farmer grows food and takes care of animals.

✓ Turkish job title: Çiftçi

✓ Pronunciation: /FAR-mir/ (Farmir)



### Train driver

English sentence: A train driver drives a train.

✓ Turkish job title: Tren makinisti

✓ Pronunciation: /TREYN DRAY-vir/ (Treyn drayvir)

✓ English sentence: A judge works in a court and makes decisions about the law.

✓ Turkish job title: Hakim

✓ Pronunciation: /CAC/ (Cac) with a soft "c" sound similar to "j"),

✓ English sentence: An electrician fixes and installs electrical systems.

✓ Turkish job title: Elektrikçi

Pronunciation: /i-lek-TRI-şın/ (İlektrişın)

### Mechanic

✓ English sentence: A mechanic fixes cars and machines.

Turkish job title: Tamirci

Pronunciation: /mi-KA-nik/ (Mikanik)











### **Businessman**

English sentence: A businessman works in business. He sells or manages products and services.

✓ Turkish job title: İş adamı (for men) / İş kadını (for women)

Pronunciation: /Bİ-zınıs-men/ (Bizınısmen)

### Surgeon

☑ English sentence: A surgeon operates on people in a hospital.

✓ Turkish job title: Cerrah

✓ Pronunciation: /SÖR-cın/ (Sörcın)

### **Psychologist**

English sentence: A psychologist helps people with their feelings and problems.

✓ Turkish job title: Psikolog

✓ Pronunciation: /say-KO-lo-cist/ (Saykolocist)

### Travel agent

English sentence: A travel agent helps people plan their trips and holidays.

✓ Turkish job title: Seyahat acentesi

✓ Pronunciation: /TRA-vil EY-cint/ (Travil eycint)

### **Photographer**

☑ English sentence: A photographer takes photos of people, places, or things.

☑ Turkish job title: Fotoğrafçı

Pronunciation: /fə-TO-gra-fır/ (Fotografır)



### **Businesswoman**

✓ English sentence: A businesswoman works in business. She sells or manages products and services.

✓ Turkish job title: İş kadını

Pronunciation: /Bİ-zınıs-wu-mın/ (Bizınıs vumın)



### **Doctor**

English sentence: A doctor helps sick people feel better.

✓ Turkish job title: Doktor

✓ Pronunciation: /DOK-tır/ (Doktır)

### Actor

English sentence: An actor acts in movies, TV shows, or plays.

✓ Pronunciation: /EK-tır/ (Ektır)

Artist

English sentence: An artist makes art, like paintings or drawings.

✓ Turkish job title: Sanatçı

✓ Pronunciation: /AR-tist/ (Artist)



Receptionist

English sentence: A receptionist answers phones and helps visitors in an office or hotel.

Turkish job title: Resepsiyonist

Pronunciation: /ri-SEP-şin-ist/ (Risepşinist)



**Dentist** 

English sentence: A dentist checks and fixes people's teeth.

Turkish job title: Diş hekimi

Pronunciation: /DEN-tist/ (Dentist)



### **Pilot**

English sentence: A pilot flies an airplane.

Turkish job title: Pilot

Pronunciation: /PAY-lit/ (Paylit)



### Writer

English sentence: A writer writes books, stories, or articles.

Turkish job title: Yazar

Pronunciation: /RAY-tır/ (Raytır)




### Musician

### **Paramedic**

English sentence: A paramedic helps sick or hurt people before they go to the hospital.

☑ Turkish job title: Paramedik / Acil sağlık görevlisi

Pronunciation: /pe-ri-ME-dik/ (Perimedik)



### Flight attendant

English sentence: A flight attendant helps passengers on an airplane.

✓ Turkish job title: Kabin memuru

Pronunciation: /FLAYT i-TEN-dint/ (Flayt itendint)



### Designer

English sentence: A designer creates new things like clothes, logos, or products.

✓ Turkish job title: Tasarımcı

✓ Pronunciation: /dı-ZAY-nır/ (Dızaynır)



### Fashion designer


English sentence: A fashion designer makes new clothes and fashion styles.
